#### 1. Pension benefit data – Emmett O'Donnell

The subcommittee has completed the survey for updating the matrix of pension benefits.

# 2. Other Post Employment Benefit data - Mike Kelly

## 3. Financial impact study - Larry Chu

The subcommittee spoke with John Bartel and reviewed the work and methodology for the study performed for the City of Sausalito by Bartel & Associates.

The Bartel study will look at the funded status and tell each participant what they should be contributing. The funding status will be evaluated not only on an actuarial basis, but also a market basis by bringing in more recent data that can be sensitive on the outcome of investment returns. The result will produce the funded status in a more detailed and understandable format.

The cost of the study might seem to be based on the number of employees or the amount of money in the plan, but the primary variable cost is in getting good data to put into the model. That effort is virtually equal to any participant in the study.

The estimated cost of a study is approximately \$3,500 per participant. The City of Novato has already been in contact with Bartel. Bartel will also be providing additional references for similar studies done for other cities.

### 5. Draft of Report to the MCCMC

The initial deliverable back to the MCCMC membership is a report with the following information and findings:

- List of policy issues to be discussed at a regional or statewide level

A draft of a report is to be presented to the committee at the committee's March 28<sup>th</sup> meeting, finalized at the meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>, and released to the MCCMC at its April 27<sup>th</sup> meeting.
